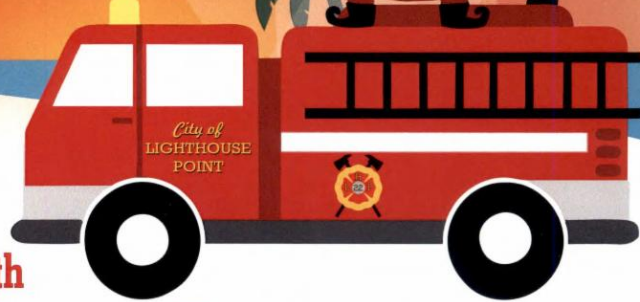

FROM THE CHIEF



As we approach the holiday season, it's a time for celebration, gathering with loved ones, and creating joyful memories. It's also a time when we see an uptick in certain types of criminal activity, particularly thefts, scams, and vehicle burglaries. To keep your season bright and protect yourself, your family, and our community, we'd like to share some important holiday crime prevention tips.

First, if you're shopping in stores or online, be mindful of how you store and transport gifts. Avoid leaving packages visible in your car, which can be an easy target for opportunistic thieves. **Please remember to secure your vehicles and remove valuables and key fobs!**

For those traveling, ensure your home is secure before leaving. Lock all doors and windows, set any alarms, and consider using smart home devices to give the appearance that someone is home. Our department also offers a **Closed Home Program** that residents can register for online, <https://www.lighthousepointfl.gov/244/Police-Department>. Through this program, officers will periodically check your home while you're away, adding an extra layer of security. Let a trusted neighbor know of your plans as well, so they can keep an eye out.

Holiday scams are also on the rise. Be cautious about unsolicited emails, messages, or phone calls requesting personal information or donations to unfamiliar charities. Always verify the legitimacy of any organization or individual before sharing personal information or making a donation.

Lastly, our officers will be increasing patrols in shopping areas and neighborhoods to help deter criminal activity. We encourage everyone to stay vigilant, be aware of their surroundings, and report any suspicious activity immediately. Together, we can work to make this season safe and enjoyable for all.

From our department to your family, we wish you a happy and safe, holiday season. Please don't hesitate to reach out to our officers with any concerns or questions—our

community's safety is our top priority.

Police Department Issues Safety Guidelines for Electric Rideable Devices



The Lighthouse Point Police Department strongly urges parents, guardians, and young riders to prioritize safety and exercise good common sense when purchasing and operating electric rideable devices. While some of these devices may meet legal criteria for operation, the department emphasizes caution due to potential hazards posed by local traffic and the high speeds these devices can reach. Proper usage and compliance with Florida law are essential to ensure everyone's safety.

With the growing popularity of these vehicles, including some that resemble mini dirt bikes but meet electric bicycle criteria, it is vital for parents, guardians, and riders to understand their proper use and the legal distinctions between electric bicycles and electric dirt bikes.

Please remember: The use of electric bicycles, dirt bikes, or other motorized devices is prohibited in all Lighthouse Point City parks, including athletic fields.

The Lighthouse Point Police Department strongly recommends that parents and guardians use good judgment when purchasing electric rideable devices for children, even if they are technically legal to operate. Please read the safety guidelines memorandum from the LHP Police Department.

Broward County Homestead Exemption

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office hosts a series of community outreach events each month throughout Broward County. Deputy Appraisers will be available to assist with Homestead Senior and other property tax exemption applications, as well as answer questions on property taxes. They are also accepting applications for Portability. The outreach program is designed to provide convenient and accessible service to the residents of Broward County. All outreach events listed are open to the public.

Required Documents

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of permanent residency

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office will be in Lighthouse Point at City

Hall on the 4th Monday of each month, from 10:30 am to 12:00 pm in order to help residents apply for a Homestead Exemption.

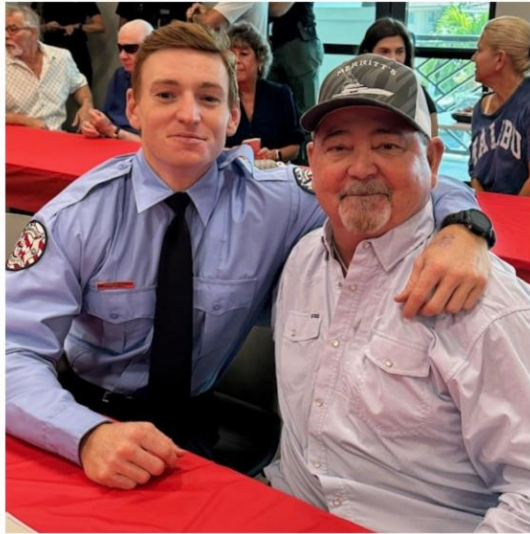

Canal Dredging

A contractor has been selected to perform the two tasks in Phase 1. Contract documents and a permit from the Army Corps of Engineers have been received. Phase 1 of the dredging project was mobilized in October 2024. Dredging began on 10/28/2024.

Lift Station 224 Generator Installation

Broward County has completed the initial generator installation. Landscaping and equipment shading final plans have been reviewed and comments submitted. The proposed fencing and landscaping is in procurement with Broward County. In mid-October the City received notice that the new pumps have failed. The new completion date is March 2025.

Pompano Reuse Irrigation Project (City of Pompano Beach)

This City of Pompano Beach project will install a Reuse water system in another section of the City in the Pompano Beach service area south of NE 27th Street and west of Lighthouse Drive. The project began staging in April 2024. Pompano has fully completed the installation of the reuse system expansion for Phase V in LHP. They are currently undergoing regulatory system certification with Broward County. Once the system has been certified for use, they will initiate the City's Oasis Reuse program.

FPL Storm Secure Underground Project(s)

FPL is installing underground electrical infrastructure in the Marina neighborhood and an area straddling Lighthouse Drive from NE 24th Street north to NE 27th Court. The project is ongoing with conduit, wiring and transformer installations.
