Police Department Issues Safety Guidelines for Electric Rideable Devices



The Lighthouse Point Police Department strongly urges parents, guardians, and young riders to prioritize safety and exercise good common sense when purchasing and operating electric rideable devices. While some of these devices may meet legal criteria for operation, the department emphasizes caution due to potential hazards posed by local traffic and the high speeds these devices can reach. Proper usage and compliance with Florida law are essential to ensure everyone's safety.

With the growing popularity of these vehicles, including some that resemble mini dirt bikes but meet electric bicycle criteria, it is vital for parents, guardians, and riders to understand their proper use and the legal distinctions between electric bicycles and electric dirt bikes.

Please remember: The use of electric bicycles, dirt bikes, or other motorized devices is prohibited in all Lighthouse Point City parks, including athletic fields.

The Lighthouse Point Police Department strongly recommends that parents and guardians use good judgment when purchasing electric rideable devices for children, even if they are technically legal to operate.



Canal Dredging

The contractor is halfway through Phase 1, having completed Canal Battello, Canal St. Elena and Canal Della Gondola. Remaining areas in Phase 1 are Canal Di S. Pietro, Canal Di S. Polo and the Southside of Sample Rd Bridge.

Lift Station 224 Repairs

The rehabilitation of MPS 224's pumps, piping, generator and adjacent roadway have been completed. The beautification phase of this project (new fence and landscaping)

has started and will be completed By March 2025.

Pompano Reuse Irrigation Project (City of Pompano Beach)

The City of Pompano Beach has installed a Reuse water system in another section of the City in the Pompano Beach service area south of NE 27th Street and west of Lighthouse Drive. The project began staging in April 2024. Pompano has fully completed the installation of the reuse system expansion for Phase V in LHP. They are currently undergoing regulatory system certification with Broward County. Once the system has been certified for use, they will initiate the City's Oasis Reuse program. The affected roads have been repaved.

FPL Storm Secure Underground Project(s)

The road crossings have been completed and the final house hookups are ongoing.
