Keeping Our Kids Safe: What Parents Need to Know About E-Bikes and Electric Device



Electric bicycles, scooters, and other motorized devices have become increasingly popular with young riders. While these devices can offer fun and convenience, they also come with **serious safety concerns**—especially when they are used improperly or without supervision.

Over the past year, our Police Department has worked hard to **educate the community** about the laws surrounding electric mobility devices and the **potential dangers they pose**. We've issued several media updates explaining what is legal in Florida and how to ensure these devices are being used safely.

Moreover, other parts of the state have recently reported **severe injuries to children** riding e-bikes and similar devices—often due to high speeds, lack of protective

equipment, or improper use. These incidents serve as a **powerful reminder** that safety must come first.

Parents: Your Role Is Critical

We are urging all parents to take an active role in making informed decisions about electric devices. Just because something is sold online or in stores, does **not** mean it's safe—for your child to use.

Before purchasing an e-bike, electric scooter, or any similar device for your child, please:

- **I Check Florida laws** regarding age requirements and permitted use
- **I Ensure helmets and protective gear** are worn at all times
- **I Supervise** your child's use, especially in public areas
- **I Talk with your child** about safe riding habits and responsibilities

Your involvement can help prevent accidents and save lives. Be informed, stay engaged, and make safety a top priority.

Education Through Community Programs

To support these efforts, the Police Department has been partnering with the City's Recreation Department to offer **educational safety classes** throughout the year. These sessions will also be included in this year's **City Summer Camp Program**, helping young riders learn:

- The laws related to e-bikes and scooters
- Safe operation and riding behavior
- Proper use of helmets and safety equipment
- The importance of awareness in shared spaces

A Shared Responsibility

We believe safety is a shared responsibility between parents, the community, and law enforcement. By working together, we can reduce injuries and help ensure our children ride **safely, legally, and responsibly**.

Recycle Right!

What items and materials are NOT recyclable?

Non-recyclable materials should be placed in your standard trash receptacles. Be certain that your trash cans are not overloaded and that their lids can close all the way. containers.

Typically, items below cannot be recycled via curbside recycling programs.

- Plastic bags (these can often be returned to a local grocery store)
- Ceramic dishes, cups and glassware
- Juice boxes/juice pouches
- Foam cups or packing materials
- Windows, mirrors, sheet glass

Try to reduce and reuse these items instead of putting them in the trash.



Do not bag recyclables. They must be loose in the bin.



Plastic bags are not accepted as part of curbside recycling programs - they get tangled in equipment and threaten worker safety.

If you collect your recyclables in a bag, empty them directly into your cart and reuse the bag!



No Cups with wax or plastic coatings. Invest in and carry a reusable cup instead

Eligibility for FREE or LOW-COST Mammogram and Pap Test

- At least 40 years old *and*
- Has little or no health insurance (*Share of Cost Medicaid accepted*) *and*
- Not covered by Medicare or Medicaid *and*
- Meets income guidelines of the program *and*
- Has a picture ID *and*
- Lives in Broward or Martin counties

Participants must be available to complete all diagnostic testing within 60 days.

- Clinical breast examinations
- Mammograms with tomosynthesis
- Pap tests with HPV test
- Diagnostic testing if results are abnormal

Canal Dredging

The contractor has completed Phase 1 and is starting Phase 2 which consists of the west end of the South Grand Canal.

Lift Station 224 Repairs

The rehabilitation of Lift Station 224's pumps, piping, generator, adjacent roadway, landscaping and new fence have been completed. The gates are being fabricated and will be installed soon to complete this project.

Pompano Reuse Irrigation Project (City of Pompano Beach)

The City of Pompano Beach has installed a Reuse water system in another section of the City in the Pompano Beach service area, south of NE 27th Street and west of Lighthouse Drive. Pompano has fully completed the installation of the reuse system expansion for Phase V. The system has been certified by Broward County and the individual home hookups are being scheduled. The affected roads have been repaved and striped. A punch list of asphalt corrections has been made and will be completed before project closeout.

FPL Storm Secure Underground Project(s)

The road crossings have been completed and the final house hookups are ongoing.
