Public Safety Reminder: E-Bike Use in Lighthouse Point

E-bikes have become increasingly popular, especially among our youth. While they offer a fun and convenient way to get around, they also come with responsibilities. The Lighthouse Point Police Department wants to ensure everyone—especially children—rides safely and within the law.

Know the Law: E-Bike Classifications

Under Florida Statute 316.20655:

- **Class 1:** Pedal-assist, max speed 20 mph
- **Class 2:** Throttle-assist, max speed 20 mph
- **Class 3:** Pedal-assist, max speed 28 mph

E-bikes over 750 watts or capable of speeds beyond 28 mph are considered motor vehicles and must be registered and insured.

▮ Recent Safety Concerns

We've received reports of:

- Riders refusing to yield to cars and riding in the middle of the road
- Ignoring stop signs and traffic signals
- Riding with passengers on bikes not built for more than one person

These behaviors are dangerous and violate traffic laws. **Residents are encouraged to report E-Bike violations and reckless riding by contacting the Lighthouse Point Police Department's non-emergency line at ▮ 954-942-8080.**

▮ Traffic Laws Still Apply

E-bike riders must follow the same rules as bicyclists and motorists:

- ▮ Obey signs and signals
- ▮ Use hand signals
- ▮ Yield when required

▮ Helmets are required by law for riders under 16 and strongly recommended for all

▮ Enforcement Is Underway

Officers will be monitoring E-Bike use and may issue citations for:

- Reckless or unsafe riding
- Blocking or impeding traffic
- Riding unregistered or overpowered

E-Bikes over 750 watts or capable of speeds beyond 28 mph that are not registered and insured will be impounded.

▮▮▮▮ Parents, Please Talk to Your Kids

Parents, there have been numerous E-Bike accidents nationwide involving children causing serious injury. The Lighthouse Point Police Department strongly suggests that before allowing your child to ride, consider their age, maturity, and readiness to handle an E-Bike safely. These bikes can reach high speeds and require responsible operation—especially near traffic and pedestrians.

Let's work together to keep Lighthouse Point safe for everyone.

Be Prepared.

Trim Trees and Shrubbery: Now is the time to trim trees and shrubbery, and remove coconuts. All



vegetation is picked up in the City on a weekly basis. Having your property maintained before a storm will help to ensure that our Public Works Department will be able to assist all areas of the City during unexpected emergencies. Please remember, per City Code Section 8-23, all contractor-generated trash must be removed by the company generating

the contractor-generated trash.

Bag It - Don't Blow It: Per City Code Section 11-155, no person shall throw debris of any kind, including lawn clippings or vegetation, into the canal. Both residents and hired landscapers should bag any lawn clippings or vegetation instead of blowing them into the canal.

Dispose of Trash and Unwanted Household Items: Now is the time to get rid of unwanted items. In previous years many residents waited until a hurricane was on its way before they emptied out their garages to make room for vehicles, and unfortunately had to bring their unwanted household items and trash back into their garages because there wasn't enough time for trash collection.

Shelters or Evacuation Plan: Be sure to form a family hurricane action plan. Lighthouse Point is a mandatory evacuation area with category 3 and above storms. Determine what hurricane plan you and your family will follow should the need arise, how your home will be secured, and where you will stay. The best place to stay is in a home which is outside of the evacuation zone and that has hurricane shutters, food, and supplies.

Summer Travel: Home Security Tips

As families across our community prepare for summer vacations, it's important to take proactive steps to safeguard your home while you're away. Before you leave, make your home appear occupied. Stop newspaper and mail delivery, or ask a trusted neighbor to collect them daily. Use timers to turn lights on and off in different rooms. If you have a home security system or cameras, make sure they are working properly, and notify your alarm company of your travel dates.

Take advantage of the Police Department's [Closed Home / Vacation Watch Program](https://www.lighthousepointfl.gov/278/Closed-Home-Program). Residents can stop by the police department to register, or conveniently sign up online, <https://www.lighthousepointfl.gov/278/Closed-Home-Program>. While you're away, officers will periodically check your property to ensure everything is in order. This free program is just one way we help keep your home—and your peace of mind—secure.

Recycling Contamination

When residents mistakenly place non-recyclable items into recycling bins, it can degrade the quality of recyclable materials, increase the costs of sorting and cleaning and pose hazardous risks to workers and equipment at recycling facilities.

This problem is the most significant challenge cities face in managing effective recycling programs.

Please remember to Recycle Right, and when in doubt, throw it out!

Not Everything Made From Plastic Is Recyclable, And That's Ok!

Trash it instead



NO Garden Hoses, Rope, Leashes, Wire & String

"Tanglers" like garden hoses, ropes, electrical cords and string should ALWAYS go in the trash, never in the recycle bin. These items wrap around equipment and threaten the safety of MRF workers. They can even shut down an entire recycling center.



NO Dirty Diapers

Dirty diapers and pet waste should ALWAYS go in the trash, never in the recycle bin! They can contaminate acceptable recyclables and transform it into trash. Keep your recyclables clean.



NO Cups with Plastic or Wax Coating

Cups with plastic or waxed coatings are not recyclable. The plastic lid should be trashed as well.



NO Polystyrene Foam & Plastic

Polystyrene foam and plastic "to-go" containers and cups are made of non-recyclable materials and cannot be collected curbside. Packing peanuts can't be recycled either, although some shipping stores will take back peanuts for reuse.

NE 21st Ave & NE 38th St Drainage and Roadway Improvements Project

This project consists of paving and drainage improvements, and its purpose is to eliminate standing water within the City right-of-way and the adjacent properties. The contractor has completed Phase 1 and will complete Phase 2 by the end of July.

Pompano Reuse Irrigation Project (City of Pompano Beach)

The City of Pompano Beach has completed the installation of the reuse system expansion for Phase V. The system has been certified by Broward County and the individual home hookups are being scheduled. The affected roads have been repaved and striped. A punch list of asphalt corrections has been made and will be completed before project closeout.

FPL Storm Secure Underground Project(s)

The road crossings have been completed and the final house hookups are ongoing.
