

Be Prepared.

Trim Trees and Shrubbery: Now is the time to trim trees and shrubbery, and remove coconuts. All vegetation is picked up in the City on a weekly basis. Having your property maintained before a storm will help to ensure that our Public Works

Department will be able to assist all areas of the City during unexpected emergencies. Please remember, per City Code Section 8-23, all contractor-generated trash must be removed by the company generating the contractor-generated trash.

Bag It - Don't Blow It: Per City Code Section 11-155, no person shall throw debris of any kind, including lawn clippings or vegetation, into the canal. Both residents and hired landscapers should bag any lawn clippings or vegetation instead of blowing them into the canal.

Dispose of Trash and Unwanted Household Items: Now is the time to get rid of unwanted items. In previous years many residents waited until a hurricane was on its way before they emptied out their garages to make room for vehicles, and unfortunately had to bring their unwanted household items and trash back into their garages because there wasn't enough time for trash collection.

Shelters or Evacuation Plan: Be sure to form a family hurricane action plan. Lighthouse Point is a mandatory evacuation area with category 3 and above storms. Determine what hurricane plan you and your family will follow should the need arise, how your home will be secured, and where you will stay. The best place to stay is in a home which is outside of the evacuation zone and that has hurricane shutters, food, and supplies.

Let's Recycle Better, Together

Every time you choose to recycle, you're giving that item a second life to serve a new purpose and save natural resources. Now more than ever, it's important that only the right items, free from contamination, make their way into your recycling bin.

Do Not Bag Recyclables. They Must Be Loose In The Bin!

No plastic bags, film or flexible packaging



NO Bagged Recyclables

Never bag your recyclables. Instead, put the items directly into your recycling container. It's the best thing you can do to ensure items get a second life. If you collect your recyclables in a bag, simply transfer the items from the bag into your final recycling bin and reuse the bag!



NO Plastic Bags

Loose plastic bags are almost never accepted in curbside programs because they get tangled in equipment and threaten worker safety. So remember, no loose plastic bags and don't bag your recyclables. Find where you can recycle plastic bags at plasticfilmrecycling.org.



NO Plastic Wraps & Film

Plastic wrap, bubble wrap, plastic sandwich bags, and freezer bags should not go in the recycle bin. But reuse them whenever possible.



NO Flexible Packaging

Currently, flexible packaging like chip bags and juice or soup pouches cannot be recycled in curbside programs because it's made from multiple materials. Put these items in the trash.

Keep Batteries Out of Recycling and Waste Carts

Batteries are hazardous waste and can cause fires. Properly dispose and recycle at a collection center.

Safety Tips

Safety Tips

Keep a Safe Distance: Collection trucks stop and back up frequently.

Stay Clear: Keep your children clear of carts and our vehicles/trucks. Let the collection team in your neighborhood load trash or recycling into the truck.



Cool Your Coals!

Just as those coals helped to get your campfire or backyard BBQ going, they can quickly start a fire in your trash cart, the back of a collection truck or at a waste facility.

Properly dispose of your hot coals and ashes:

- Cool your coals - hot coals and fresh ashes stay hot for several days. Let them cool for more than 48 hours before disposal.
- Place your hot coals and ashes in a metal container and cover them with water to fully extinguish them.
- Do not place coals and ashes in a plastic, paper, wood or galvanized container.
- Do not place other combustibles in the container with the coals or ashes.



Prevent Trash Fires in Your Community

Did you know? The most common causes of trash fires are hot coals, ashes, and flammable items, such as batteries and household chemicals. You can help keep your family, community and collection workers safe and prevent trash fires by properly disposing of coals and household hazardous waste.



Hidden Household Hazards

Many everyday household items, such as batteries, disinfectants and cleaners, can cause a fire in your trash cart or in your neighborhood when they come in contact with other materials or get compacted inside a collection truck.

To protect your family and community, keep these items out of your cart:

- Batteries of any kind, including lithium ion
- Compressed gas cylinders
- Combustible liquids
- Garden and pool chemicals
- Household disinfectants and chemicals
- Motor oil and oil rags
- Paint and paint-related products
- Unknown substances
- Vehicle fluids
- Flammable fluids, like hand sanitizer
- Aerosol containers



Reminder, the library's adult wing is closed from Monday, August 18th through Saturday, September 6th. Although the adult wing is closed, the youth wing is open regular library hours and will have new adult books, limited patron computers, a photocopy machine, and youth collections.

This month, grant-funded renovations continue in the Library. All adult books will be cleaned and moved while new carpet, paint, and shelving is installed in the adult wing. To improve energy efficiency, new air conditioners and LED lighting

will be installed in the coming months. To improve patron comfort, in November new furniture will be installed. Renovations and improvements are supported by a grant from the Florida Department of State's Division of Library and Information Services, the Walt and Mary Barker Fund, and donations to the Friends of the Library.


