**PROJECT UPDATE**

**NE 23rd Avenue Bridge (No. 867202) Replacement Project**

**NE 23rd Avenue from NE 29th Street to NE 30th Street**

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four has contracted with Anzac Contractors, Inc., to replace the NE 23rd Avenue Bridge over the Ibis Waterway, along NE 23rd Avenue from NE 29th Street to NE 30th Street, in the city of Lighthouse Point. This project consists of replacing the existing two-lane bridge over the Ibis Waterway. Improvements will also include signage, paving, restriping, irrigation, lighting, curb and gutter, and new pedestrian facilities to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

**PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

To date, Anzac Contractors, Inc. has removed the bridge deck of the existing bridge. Pile driving activities are tentatively expected to begin Thursday, February 6th and end in late spring 2020. During pile driving, heightened noise levels and vibrations can be expected. Marine traffic will be restricted during active construction but will remain open for all federal holidays and/or weekends.
