SR 5/FEDERAL HIGHWAY MOBILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four will improve mobility along SR 5/Federal Highway from SR 834/Sample Road to the Broward/Palm Beach County Line in the cities of Lighthouse Point, Pompano Beach and Deerfield Beach. This project will address mobility improvements by widening the roadway to accommodate bike lanes and reconstructing medians, portions of the roadway and sidewalks.

PROJECT UPDATE

One inside lane in each direction will be closed intermittently on SR 5/Federal Highway from Sample Road to the Broward/Palm Beach County Line to reduce the width of the median for roadway widening. This closure may last for approximately three months.

Construction activities associated with the widening will take place Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Beginning the week of April 27, the contractor will be working on the next segment on Federal Highway from NE 44th Street to NE 49th Street and SE 10th Street to SE 2nd Court. Several median crossovers along Federal Highway will be temporarily closed during construction. Access to businesses and residences will be maintained using the closest median opening or intersection.
