PROJECT UPDATE—PROPOSED BRIDGE DECK ACTIVITY
NE 23rd Avenue Bridge (No. 867202) Replacement Project
NE 23rd Avenue from NE 29th Street to NE 30th Street

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four has contracted with Anzac Contractors, Inc., to replace the NE 23rd Avenue Bridge over the Ibis Waterway, along NE 23rd Avenue from NE 29th Street to NE 30th Street, in the city of Lighthouse Point. This project consists of replacing the existing two-lane bridge over the Ibis Waterway. Improvements will also include signage, paving, restriping, irrigation, lighting, curb and gutter, and new pedestrian facilities to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES

To date, Anzac Contractors, Inc. has completed the bridge's concrete substructure and will be moving forward with the proposed bridge deck installation. For this proposed work, the Contractor will be installing beams and formwork that will cause a temporary vertical clearance restriction (approximately 4' from the Mean High Water Elevation) for marine traffic under the bridge. Once completed, the Contractor will remove the formwork and the bridge vertical clearance will be set per plan. This work is expected to start the first week of November 2020 and last for approximately 4-5 weeks pending any unforeseen issues. Marine traffic will be restricted during active construction but will remain open for all federal holidays and/or weekends.
