PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Four has contracted with Anzac Contractors, Inc., to replace the NE 23rd Avenue Bridge over the Ibis Waterway, in the city of Lighthouse Point. This project consists of replacing the existing two-lane bridge along NE 23rd Avenue from NE 29th Street to NE 30th Street. Improvements will also include signage, paving, restriping, irrigation, lighting, curb and gutter, and new pedestrian facilities to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES

To date, Anzac Contractors has completed the concrete substructure of the bridge and installed the bridge deck. Bridge deck operations included the installation of beams and temporary framing (formwork) in preparation for the upcoming concrete pouring operation.

MARINE IMPACTS

- Beginning Tuesday, January 12, at 5:00 a.m., the navigable waterway under the NE 23rd Avenue Bridge will be closed for 24 hours to pour concrete for the bridge deck. The date of this operation is subject to change pending weather conditions.
- For the duration of the bridge deck work, the vertical clearance under the bridge will be reduced to approximately 4.79 feet.
